REPORTING SYMPTOMS,

CLOSE CONTACT OR POSITIVE TEST RESULTS

1

If you tested positive for COVID-19, have COVID-19 symptoms or have experienced possible exposure, email covid@coe.edu and provide your phone number.

2

Immediately quarantine in your housing space away from others. Initiate health care and arrange a testing appointment if needed. For health and wellness services, visit www.tinyurl.com/coe-health-services.

A COVID-19 response team member will contact you via phone to determine the next steps.

If you tested positive for COVID-19, you will be required to isolate in a space with a private bed and bath for 10 days from your first date of symptoms or your test date, whichever is earlier.*

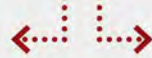
If you have been in close contact (within 6 feet for more than 15 minutes) with a person who has tested positive, you will be required to quarantine for 14 days from the last date of exposure.*

3c

If you are experiencing illness symptoms but have not had contact with someone who is COVID-19 positive, you will be required to self isolate in your residence until you are no longer ill.*

If you had close contact with someone who is positive for COVID-19 and you are symptomatic, you will be quarantined in a space with a private bathroom, and food will be delivered.

If you had close contact with someone who is positive for COVID-19 and you are not symptomatic, you will be able to quarantine in your campus residence with access to bathrooms, laundry and limited dining services.

* You must complete your full quarantine or isolation period, be fever-free without medication for 24 hours and symptoms must have improved prior to resuming campus activities.

WHAT COUNTS AS CLOSE CONTACT?

- You were within 6 feet of someone who has COVID-19 for a total of 15 minutes or more.
- You provided care to someone who is sick with COVID-19.
- You shared eating or drinking utensils.
- You had direct physical contact with the person (handshake, hug, kiss, etc.).
- They sneezed, coughed or somehow got respiratory droplets on you.
